

#### LIVE THE LITURGY

#### Inspiration for the week

Ultimately, what does God promise to give us when we pray? The short answer to that question is God. God promises to give Himself to us in prayer. Prayer is about union with God, not receiving favors. When God comes to us in prayer, His presence comes with faith, hope, and love. When we find these virtues enhanced and nurtured, we know that our prayer has been heard and answered. When we seek out, listen to, and live by these virtues we find ourselves led back to God and more united with the Divine Presence. We struggle with what we want God to do and how we want our prayer validated. That's what makes Jesus' prayer, the Our Father, so perfect. It celebrates a deepening intimate relationship of trust between our Creator and us. When we persistently cry out for God in love, how can that prayer go unanswered?



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint James the Apostle is also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater to distinguish him from the other James in Jesus' group of twelve. Most of what we know about Saint James is recorded in the New Testament. He and his brother John were collected by Jesus along the sea of Galilee. Matthew 4:18-22 tells the story of Jesus calling first Simon Peter and his brother Andrew and then the sons of Zebedee. In Mark 3:17 the brothers receive a nickname from Jesus who calls them "sons of thunder" because of their many extreme reactions, like that in Luke 9:54 when they offer to call down fire on a Samaritan village.

Saint James was part of Jesus' intimate circle, a witness to the Transfiguration, the resurrection of Jarius' daughter, and the agony in the garden of Gethsemane. In A.D. 44 Herod Agrippa had "James, the brother of John, killed by the sword." (Acts 12:2) He is the only apostle whose martyrdom is written of in the New Testament.

According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, Spain where his relics were rediscovered in 9th century. This tradition has sometimes been attributed to a passage in the Song of Roland which tells of St. James appearing to Charlemagne in a dream, prophesying that Charlemagne would conquer the Moors in Spain. This was followed by a vision of stars which if followed would lead to the saint's lost tomb. In the Middle Ages Compostela was a hugely popular pilgrimage site. The saint's relics continue to rest in the cathedral there and one can still undertake the pilgrimage.

This weekend's readings are about desiring God above everything else in our lives. Solomon, the wisest king of ancient Israel, acquired that wisdom to serve God because he asked for it from God and desired it more than his very life! St. Paul exclaimed to the Romans that all of us have a predestined call from God to be "conformed to Christ"; that is, to love nothing more than God and to live like it! In the Gospel, Jesus describes heaven as that "buried treasure" or "pearl of great price. " Notice: heaven comes at a cost because true love is sacrificial. The people in Jesus' parable gave up "everything" to get the treasure and the pearl. But they did this "out of joy" because they knew that what they would gain—God would be worth it!

We often believe the lie from hell that God is not enough. That's why we cling to our possessions, skip mass to sleep or watch sports, or choose to spend more time daily sitting on a toilet than praying on our knees. We do this to feel safe but this will give us eternal death. Remember, God is calling you to heaven; what you need to do is respond. To love God, it comes down to the little daily choices! Choose to stop wasting your time scrolling on your phone and invest the bonus time you have with God, praying. Choose to love others and act it out; choose to for-give your enemies. It's only by choosing heaven that we will actually go there. And if you don't desire heaven, ask God for the desire and He will grant it because He is merciful and loves you! He is generous; just look at the cross...
