Recently, Notre Dame Parish established a team of parishioners with "Big Smiles" to welcome everyone into our church.


Some Notre Dame attendees are just beginning to feel comfortable since COVID, while others are new or visiting from other parishes.

Father Allen, pastor of Notre Dame, and Father DeMartinis, who is a teacher and theater arts director in Erie, were ordained on April 25, 1997 by Erie Bishop Donald Trautman. Both priests grew up in the Shenango Valley and were members of Notre Dame Parish. An anniversary celebration for Father Allen will take place at the 11 a.m. Mass on April 24 followed by a reception in the Multi-Purpose Room.



ND Parishioners Take Part in Churchwide Listening Sessions

In recent months, Notre Dame
Parish took part in the Synod
process (a process of journeying
together and listening to each other
in dialogue, prayer, and
discernment). As directed by the
Pope, and facilitated by the Diocese
of Erie, parishioners were given the
opportunity to participate in a
listening session and be heard.

Numerous parishioners participated in the sessions where we listened to each other and discussed the topic *Journeying Together*. This was an opportunity for our faithful to express their concerns, hopes, and ideas about our Catholic Church and how we can better live the gospel message.

There were several themes that surfaced from our gatherings. Some were questions, concerns, and desires relating to our Bishop and how eager the members are to know him better and the desire to feel that we are *all in this together*.

Another theme was centered on our priests and how they are stretched to the max, and it is our responsibility to step up and foster involvement in our church and community. We are all eager to understand why we have such a shortage of men desiring to join the priesthood.

And still another theme revolved around our parish life and how we need and want to change and invigorate our members. Many are eager to learn more about the Catholic faith, to study the bible and its teachings, and to get more people involved in our parish life.

Quite possibly the most challenging of themes was that of engaging our youth and igniting the Catholic spirit within them. Our youth of today will become our leaders and decision-makers but if they are not here among us in church, how will they be able to lead us. Although this was not a time for "answers," it was great to see the desires of our

parishioners to build a community of faithful members eager to serve God, serve one another, and be present and inviting to all in our community.

We invite every one to pray for our church, our Bishop and our priests, and experience the Sacraments as a community of believers. Don't be a stranger!
