Church of Notre Dame raises more than \$15,000 for Sunday video Mass

Notre Dame parishioners and people from all over the U.S. donated \$15,430 to Church of Notre Dame during the #iGiveCatholic campaign that culminated on Giving Tuesday Nov. 29.

The money will defray the costs of Notre Dame's weekly video Mass that is posted on YouTube each Sunday as well as on the parish website, www.notredame-pa.org.

In setting up the parish's #iGiveCatholic campaign this year, Father Richard Allen noted that: "Once the COVID experience began, we found the need to televise our Sunday Mass. This cost is about \$1,200 monthly. Any donation is greatly appreciated and will help with the cost."

Here are a few comments from people who donated to the video Mass project:

• "I want to support the YouTube televised Mass. I am blessed to have found it. Thank you.

• "I want to help in the online mass ministry at Notre Dame. When my father, Hugh O'Brien - a long time parishoner - was no longer physically able to come to mass, he enjoyed watching online. He especially liked seeing Ginger each week!

The Sunday video Mass was initiated in 2020 after the Erie Diocese closed churches because of the Covid outbreak.

Videographer Jerry Stigliano was hired to do all the camera and production work for the video Mass, which is taped on Friday and uploaded to YouTube on Sunday morning.

The video Mass has been very popular. During some Sundays during the worst of the Covid outbreak upwards of 5,000 viewers were watching the Notre Dame Mass on YouTube.

Even after churches were opened and regular Mass schedules resumed, the video Mass still attracts more than 1,000 viewers each week. On two different Sundays in July and August more than 3,000 people watched the video Mass.

We were extremely lucky to have a parishioner, Jerry Stigliano, who is an artistic and proficient videographer, as well as a ready library of music recorded by our own Notre Dame Folk Group over the last 30 years.
